AFP CA IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE 6

Do you qualify for Band 5?

The AFP CA 2007 -2011 attachment B contains the policing advancement strategy. This advancement strategy has broad banded AFP salary bands 2 – 5. This makes the AFP the only police force in the country where a recruit can progress from the college to senior constable without being subject to Job availability.

Importantly for members sitting on Band 4.5, they will advance to Band 5.2 *“on the anniversary date of the employee’s last advancement or their engagement”* if they have 15 years of policing experience, including in police forces other than the AFP.

For members that do not yet have 15 years policing experience, there are other ways to ensure that they will qualify for Band 5 when they arrive at the top of Band 4.

Any sworn member at pay point 4.5 that is assigned to Learning and Development, Professional Standards or Mission service with the IDG, or have 10 years experience within the AFP and undertake an inter-jurisdictional deployment of at least two years, will be entitled to transition to Band 5.2 when they reach their next anniversary date.

Further, any member that completes a two year term subsequent to the implementation of the CA 2007 – 2011, with Learning and Development, Professional Standards, or the IDG will be entitled to transition to Band 5 after having reached the top of Band 4.
