## AFPA Welcomes Appointment of New ACT CPO

**The AFPA congratulates AFP Assistant Commissioner Roman Quaedvlieg on his appointment as the new ACT Chief Police Officer. The decision was announced on March 15 by AFP Commissioner Tony Negus and ACT Minister for Police and Emergency Services Simon Corbell in a joint press statement. The appointment is effective immediately.**

Since his move to the AFP from the Australian Crime Commission in 2005, Mr Quaedvlieg has served in a variety of roles with great success. These have included stints as Manager - Economic Operations, National Manager – Border Operations, National Manager – Aviation and AFP Chief of Staff. Previously, Assistant Commissioner Quaedvlieg served as a Police Officer with Queensland Police for 15 years. It is clear that he brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the role of CPO.

In making the announcement, Simon Corbell stated: “I congratulate Assistant Commissioner Quaedvlieg on his appointment. His extensive and diverse experience will ensure ACT Policing is well placed to meet current and future law enforcement challenges for the Territory.” The AFPA wholeheartedly agrees with Minister Corbell’s sentiments.
